

ANCIENT FUSION COLLECTION



THE BYGONE ERA CHINTAK ZAMARRUD

A necklace (chintak) in the form of a collar comprising graded rectangular panels, each set with a table-cut emerald surrounded with diamonds, tapering to pear-shaped emeralds, and surmounted with a row of emerald beads and a fringe of pear-shaped emeralds, emerald beads and emerald drops.

The 11 rectangular Colombian emeralds are all claw-set in the gold in open-back mounts; the gold caps on the emerald drops are decorated with green enamel. The design of the necklace is typically Indian, common all over North India and popularly known as Guluband. Like the Mughals, the Nizams had a great fondness for emeralds, apparent in the recurrence of the gem in so many jewels in the present collection. Emeralds came to India from Colombia, via the Portuguese trade, and found their way to the many provincial courts that were actively buying gems after the disintegration of the Mughal empire. As the premier native state of India, Hyderabad attracted dealers with the choicest stones.

Emeralds were coveted not only because of their rarity and unavailability in India but also for their properties in curing disease and instilling tranquillity. Due to their fiery green color, they were regarded as the birth of spring.

The Nizams maintained a large harem in addition to the customary four wives permitted in the Islamic law. Stylistically, the jewel dates back to the mid-19th century.

Kalasha Fine Jewels is inspired by this classical Mughal-style jewel and have created a similar choker, with an underlying fringe of white pearls, which will adorn the beauty of lady worn by.

"The jewels are all heirlooms that were passed on through the Asaf Jahi dynasty, to which Osman Ali Khan belonged. In today's world, I would pin the worth of the jewellery at roughly Rs 50,000 crore," says Mohammed Safiullah, a city based historian, and cultural advisor to the Nizam Trust.

Safiullah goes on to add, "To protect the jewels, the Nizam established a 'Nizam Jewellery Trust' in the 1950s. He only had one condition. He said that the trustees could sell the jewels if need be, but only after the death of his eldest son, Azam Jah."

In fact, Azam Jah's son, Mukarram Jah, is still the eighth and titular Nizam of Hyderabad, after he inherited the title from his grandfather. "In October 1970, after the death of Azam Jah, the entire family of the Nizam came to get their share. After discussion, they decided that they would look at some international bidders as the jewels were worth several billion dollars," Safiullah says.

However, the government of India intervened and said that it was a national treasure. Almost two decades of negotiations followed. "In 1995, a deal was struck, and the Nizam's descendants were paid Rs 218 crore after taxes. This was 22 years ago, but I still feel that it was a paltry sum for the priceless jewels," Safiullah adds.

The Nizam's jewels have visited Hyderabad in the past. In 2001 and 2006, the jewellery was displayed at the city's Salar Jung Museum, and drew massive crowds.




